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In. Farringtons John Farrington of Brunswick County in the
Will Colony and Dominion of Virginia knowing the
uncertainty of human Life and being now in
perfect health of body and sound and Disposing
mind and memory do judge this the most proper
time to make my last Will and Testament for
the disposing of what Lands & goods and chattels
I at this present Time am Owner of which I do in
Manner and form as followeth. Imprimis I
acknowledge the Divine favour and Mercy of
God in so safely conducting and preserving me
through all the Dangers to which human Life is expo-
sed to this present Time Hoping the same Divine grace

may enable me to act to the end of my life as becomes
a follower of our blessed Saviour Jesus Christ by whose
advocacy and mediation with the Father I hope to be
admitted to eternal salvation. Item I give and bequeath
unto my son Robert Farrington all my Land on the
North side of Tenetoe Creek to him and his Heirs forever.
Item I give and bequeath unto my Brother Edward
Farrington all my Land on the South side of Tenetoe
Creek to him and his Heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath
unto my son John Farrington two Hundred and seventy
Acres of Land lying in Surry County to him and his
Heirs forever. Item I leave two horses to be sold for ready
money and the money to be paid in Law and Farrington
hand to pay my Debt. Item I leave two cows and no more

to be sold to raise Money and the Money to be put in
Edward Farringtons hand to pay my Debts. Item I
give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth
Farrington all my Household goods During her
Widowhood and if she shall marry then for it to be
Equally Devided between her and all my children.
Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife all my
battle Hogs and Sheep During her Widowhood and if
she should marry then for it to be Equally Devided
between her and all my children. Item I give and
bequeath unto my Son John Farrington one Gun to
him and his heirs forever. Item I give unto my
beloved wife Elizabeth Farrington one Mare called
Lucy. Lastly I Nominate constitute and Appoint

my beloved Wife Elizabeth Farrington and my
Brother Edward full and sole Executors of this my
last Will and Testament hereby revoking and nul-
ling and making void all former and other Wills
and Testaments whatsoever In Witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal the fourteenth
Day of November Anno Christi 1750.
