dispose of in form and manner as followeth Viz: Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth all my stock of all kinds and crops likewise all my household furniture with all my Tools of all kinds during her widowhood likewise I give her the Labour of two Negroes Nell and Jacob during her life Item I give to my son Charles the Money that I sold my land for only he's to give his Mother ten pounds and a young breeding Mare and to pay Mr. Thomas Simmons my Store account Likewise I give him five Negroes Lett and Trulove and Lilly at my decease the other two Nell & Jacob after his Mothers decease only my Daughter Mary is to have half the Increase of Nell after my decease likewise I give him my Chest, all the Legacies given him to him and his heirs forever with their Increase Item I bequeath unto my Daughter Mollys Children after after my Daughters decease two Negroes namely Phillis and Isaac to them and their heirs forever likewise half the Increase of Nello future Increase after my decease with their Increase to them and their heirs forever Item I likewise constitute and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth with my son Charles my whole and Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament absolutely Revoking all other Wills heretofore made by me Signed Sealed and delivered as my last Will and Testament this twenty third day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty nine
