manner and form In witness whereof I give and bequeath unto Anne
my true and Lawfull wife my now Dwelling plantation together
with all my moveable Estate Real and Personal excepted only which
I have mentioned by word of mouth should be amongst the Children

that only may be given out as Legacies and the content or quantity
of Land with the Plantation is from the great hollow proper
commonly called the pigg pen Poplar and so down the fork
and all the land below to go with the plantation. **ITEM** I
give and bequeath the upper part of the said Tract of Land to be
Equally Divided between my son James Hippen and John Platt
ITEM I give and bequeath all the land mentioned the Patent
of the Tract of Land whereon my son John Hippen and Lives
except that part that is made over in Court to my son in law
William Jenkins **ITEM** I give unto my son John Hippen and
one Shilling Sterling to the intent he may have no more Right
to any other part of my Estate and I as hereby Do allow revoke
and Disannul all and every other former Testaments wills and
Legacies Requests by me in any wise before this now made
and bequeathed Rightifying and confirming this and other to be
