of Saint Andrew in the County of Brunswick in the Colony of Virginia being
Sick in body but of perfect sound strength of Memory do make certain Constitute
and appoint this my last will and Testament in Manner and form
as followeth Very first I give my soul to Almighty God my Saviour and my
Body to be decently buried in such place where my Ep^{er} hereafter Named
Now for the settling of my Temporal Estate I shall think yet ^{first} I advise
that all my Debts which I owe in Right or vision to any person to be well
and truly satisfied out of my Estate by my Ep^{er} hereafter Named
I then I give to my beloved son Burgess Wall my land and plantation where
I now live. I then I give to my beloved Daughter Martha Monro one Shilling
Sterling. I then I give to my beloved son David Wall one Shilling Sterling
I then I give to my beloved Daughter Mary Wall one Shilling Sterling.
I then I give to my beloved son Robert Wall my old mill on Wake way
brace and eleven Acres of Land adjoining thereto Also forty Acres of Land
where his field is which is known by the Name of his field I then I give
to my son George Wall one Shilling Sterling. I then I give to my Beloved
son John Wall my Mill on Nottoway River and all the Land adjoining
thereto also one tract of Land lying Stallfap to our by where James Daniel
formerly lived also two cows and Yearlings one that is known by the Name

brace and eleven acres of land adjoining thereto also forty acres of land
where his field is which is known by the name of his field. *MEM* I give
to my son George Wall one Shilling Sterling. *MEM* I give to my Beloved
Son John Wall my Mill on Nottoway River and all the land adjoining
thereto also one tract of land lying Hallifax County where James Daniel
formerly lived also two cows and Yearlings one that is known by the name
of his cows and one that I bought of Charles Mason. *MEM* I give to my
beloved Daughter Ann Wall one Shilling Sterling. *MEM* I give to my
beloved Son Charles Wall a tract of land in Hallifax County near the
mouth of Birch's Creek and all the residue of my land and Estate of
any kind after my last Debts is paid. Lastly I make and constitute
and appoint my beloved and Beloved Wall my whole and sole Exor

 Wills and former Wills formerly made or given ^{In Writings where}
 I have herunto set my hand and seal this twenty second Day of february in the
 Year of our Lord 1758.

 Executor who entered into Bond in penalty of five hundred pounds with
 sufficient Securities. Conditions according to Law. Certificated & granted
 him for obtaining a probat in due form.
