and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form as
followeth **I**mprimis I give and Devise unto my son Thomas
Jackson my Tract of Land on the Ready Creek whereon he now Lives to
him and his Heirs for ever Also my Negro Woman Daphne after his
Mother's Decease Also one half of my Cove and Digge that run on Bear-
skin Bridge and one Pieced Heifer and all my Carpenters Coopers and
Tinkers Tools Also my Weaving Apparell. **I**tem I give unto my
Daughter Sarah Jones one Heifer I give unto my Daughter Rebecca
Watson one Heifer I give unto my Daughter Jane Bayles one Heifer
and also a Steel Beavers Trap **I**tem I give and Devise to my Daughter
Margaret Jackson and her Heirs for ever a certain Parcel of Land
containing by Estimation fifty Acres lying betwixt this Line lately run
between me and Adam Jones to Mr. Chamberlains being all that part
of Land which is between that path and the River I also give unto my
said Daughter Margaret my old bed and Furniture and my least Iron
Pold after her Mother's Death I give to my Daughter Mary Jackson the

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W^{ill} after her Mother's Death I give to my Daughter Mary Jackson the
bed and Furniture she now lieth on. Immediately after my Death also
my Horse called Diamond and my next best Iron W^{ill} after her Mother's
Death I give unto my Daughter Anne Linch a Heifer. I give and devise
unto my Daughter Mary Jackson after her Mother's Decease the
Plantation whereon I now live being whatever remains of my Patent
after Adam Sims's late Purchase and my former Bequest to my Daughter
Margaret are taken out to her and her Heir forever I give unto my
Beloved wife Rebecca Jackson all the Remains of my Estate Goods & Chattels
whatsoever to be entirely at her own Disposal. Lastly I Nominate appoint &
constitute my Loving wife my sole Executrix of this my Last will & Testament
Hereby Revoking and making void all former & other Wills whatsoever
witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this 22^d

Day of February 1739/40.

A Court held for Brunswick County January the 1st 1746

This Will was presented in Court by Rebecca Jackson Widow the Executrix therein named who made oath thereto according to Law and the same being proved by the Oath of Adam Sims one of the Witnesses thereto (who also deposed that he saw John Chapman now dead and Esther Davis the other Witnesses subscribe their Names as such in his Presence) And Ordered to be Recorded on the Motion of the said Executrix Certificate was granted her for obtaining a Probate in due form.
