unto my Son Samuel Seaton one Shilling Sterling *Item* I give and Bequeath
unto my Daughter Tabitha Spatcher one Shilling Sterling *Item* I give and
Bequeath unto my Son Ephraim Seaton half the land whereon I now live lying at
the piney meadows also four head of Cattle also one Bed & Furniture also one
Horse Fold also two Dishes & six plates to him his Heirs or Assigns for ever
Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son Benjamin Seaton the other half of
my land including the plantation whereon I now live also four head of

Cattle also one Feather Bed and Furniture Also one Whip Saw and Cross Cut

and assigns forever I do Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Milly
Seaton four head of cattle also one feather Bed and Furniture two Dishes
and six plates also one Oxen. More to her and her Heirs and assigns for ever

Money arising from the same after paying my debts and Funeral expences
be equitably divided between my Son Benjamin & Daughter Milly and I do
appoint John Phillips and my Son Ephraim Seaton Executors of this my
