 Executor hereafter named and as for what Temporal Estate it hath

named Lemmy to her and her heirs forever Item I give to my two grand

Mary Houe one feather bed and bolster and pillow and two Cotton bair
 a pair of Down sheets one pair of Nine Quarter Blankets one Nine
 Quarter red nugg a set of large Curtains and Vallins a Hide with the
 bedstead and board by shavings current Money **Item** I give and
 bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Loyd all my wearing Apparell
 one jade saddle one large Chest with a Lock and key one small Gilded
 trunk with a Lock and key one four gallon Iron pot and hook **And**
 I also give to my said Daughter Sarah ^{the} Labour of one Negro Man slave
 Named Lemmy until her Daughter Precilla be of Age or Married I also
 give to my said Daughter Sarah three new deep Dishes one new Basin
 and six new pewter plates **Item** I give all the Remainer part of my
 Money when the charges of proving my will is paid and Legacies taken out
 to be equally Divided between my two Daughters Mary Houe and
 Sarah Loyd **Item** I do hereby ordain constitute and appoint my
 well beloved son in Law Isaac Houe last of this my last Will and Testament
 hereby revoking all other Wills by me heretofore made and this only is to
 be taken for my last Will and Testament **In Witness** whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of January
