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Make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to say, principally of
kind of all. I give and recommend my Soul into the Hands of God that I leave it
and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in Decent and Christian
burial at the Discretion of my Executor, Nothing Doubting but at the General
Resurrection. I shall receive the same again by the Mighty Power of God and as
touching such Worldly Estate where with it hath pleased God to Bless me with
In this Life I give demise and dispose of the same in the following Manner
and form. ITEM I give & bequeath to my well beloved Son Fairfax
Dickerson two Hundred and forty Acres of Land being the Plantation whereon
I now live on the North side of Cedar Creek and Joining Thomas Jones's Line
and Wm Weaver's Line and John Jones's as the Patent will shew all I give to
them and his Heirs forever as also one Negro Man Named James for a
feather bed and furniture at the Years of eighteen and to have schooling at the
Discretion of my Executor out of my Estate. ITEM I give and bequeath to my
Well beloved Daughter Betty Dickerson one Negro Man Named Robin
to her and Her Heirs forever and one feather bed and furniture at the
Years of eighteen & also schooling as above said. ITEM my will and
Meaning is if either of my Children die before the Years of eighteen then
there part shall go to the other. ITEM I give to my dearly beloved wife
Winifred Dickerson During her Natural Life my Young Negro Girl Named
Lucy together with my House hold goods and Chattels and books and the
