In the Name of God Amen I Mildred Willis of
Ingfield Hall in the County of Brunswick and parish of Saint Andrew being
of sound Memory do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament I give
my soul to Almighty God my Body to the Earth and what worldly Good I have
in the following manner Inprimis I give & Bequeath to my
Daughter Sarah Willis one Negro Girl named Milly together with the sum

Three hundred pounds & interest from the day of my death
Age of twenty one years or day of Marriage I give the same to her & her Heirs
for ever I give & Bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Willis one Negro
Girt named Christian & all her Increase from the date hereof together with
the sum of three hundred pounds when she shall arrive to the age of twenty
years or day of Marriage I give the same to her and her Heirs for ever

Item it is my will that if either of Daughters Sarah & Elizabeth should
die before Marriage or twenty one years of Age that the Estate of her so
dying shall be equally divided between my five Sons hereafter mentioned

Item I give & Bequeath to my son John Willis one fifth part of the
residue of my Estate Real & Personal to him & his Heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Augustine Willis one other fifth
part of the above mentioned Residue of my Estate Real & Personal to him &
his Heirs for ever Item I give the remaining three fifths of my Estate Real
and Personal to be equally divided between my three Sons Francis Willis
Rich Willis & Lewis Willis to them & their Heirs for ever but it is my will
that the portions give my Daughters Sarah & Elizabeth remain in the hands
of my son Francis Willis until they shall arrive to the age of twenty one
years or day of Marriage he maintaining in such manner as my two Sons
