At page 3 & 4. will be seen Lucy L. B. Walker's account with the Guardian and shows a balance due her on the 1<sup>st</sup> July 1839 of Seventeen hundred & Eighty Dollars & 65 Cents, with M. till paid - for the same reasons as given in Mary R. H. Walker's acct. when due in 1838, the Guardian is not debited with interest on the balances of each year till 6 months thereafter -

At page 5 & 6. will be seen Tom E. Walker's acct. with his Guardian, and shows a balance due him on the first day of July 1839 of Three thousand four hundred & two dollars, & Sixty & a half cents with interest till now paid. - And for the same reasons given in the report above against Mary R. H. Walker, I have not charged the Guardian with interest on the balances of 1837 & 1838 till 6 months thereafter - I have debited each ward with Commissions & plant on their part or amt. of expenses paid for keeping or putting out the best advantage the expensive negroes, it being as much, if not more trouble to put them out at good horses than it would be to hire out men or healthy young women - all of which is respectfully submitted to Court.
