In the name of God amen September the 29. in the four Lord God
and thousand seven hundred fifty six I Peter Wyche of Brunswick County
being in perfect mind of memory Thanks be to God therefore bearing unto mind
that Mortality of my Body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once
to die I do make for and thus my last Will & Testament that is to say
principally of first of all I give & Recommend my Soul into the Hands of God
that gave it me & for my Body I commend it to the Earth to be Buried in a
Christian like manner at the Discretion of my Executors Nothing Doubting
but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the
Almighty Power of God Touching such Worldly Estate where with it hath
pleased God to bless me with I give Devise & Dispose of the same in following
Manner to wit I give to my Son Henry Wyche my sole &

Advers of Outlash to him of his Heirs or assigns for ever Item I give
 to my son George Wyche a parcel of Land supposing to be seven hundred acres
 more or less to wit. Beginning at small Gum a line Tree of the Land
 I purchased of Thomas Scott on the low grounds of Sountains Creek of
 thence along the line to the Great Branch thence up the said branch as
 it Meanders to the Road thence crossing the Branch of the Road to the
 line to a line made on purpose up by the River they Run into the
 Slack joining on the line of the Land I first took up thence along the line

 Jamney During of life also I lend a Negro Boy Named Roger a Negro
 Wench Named Sue During of life if the said Wench Sue brings any more
 Children if my Sons or Daughters should have the misfortune to loose
 any of their Negroes abovementioned order that they may be made to them
 of the increase of the said Wench in increase provided they loose them
 before they come to the Age abovementioned of to Receive them Item I
 give to my Son Henry Wyche the above mentioned Negro Roger after the

Death of my Loving Wife to him his Heirs or Assigns for ever I Item

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I give to my son George Wyche the above mentioned ranch due after the

Death of my Loving Wife to him his Heirs or Assigns for ever I Item

I give to my son Henry Wyche the above mentioned Negro Jannney after

the Death of my loving Wife to him his Heirs or Assigns for ever also I

leave my loving Wife the use of the Rest of my Estate until my Children

come to the Age above mentioned provided my Wife do not Marry if

she Marries I order that my Negroes to be hired out to the best advantage

for my Childrens Use also I appoint my Sons Henry Wyche &

George Wyche the Executors my Horses & Mares I leave them to the use of

my Wife & Plantation I order that my Estate may not be ^{at} praised nor

sold but that my Executors may after the Death of my Wife may

Divide my Whole Estate Equally Between all my Children that is not

given away in Legacies if I have any Ready Money to be Equally

Divided between my Children

I give to my son George Wyche the above mentioned men & after the
Death of my loving Wife to him his Heirs or Assigns for ever. Item
I give to my son Drury Wyche the above mentioned Negro Samney after
the Death of my loving Wife to him his Heirs or Assigns for ever also I
leave my loving Wife the use of the Rest of my Estate until my Children
come to the Age above mentioned provided my Wife do not marry if
she marries I order that my Negroes to be hired out to the best advantage
for my Childrens Use also I appoint my sons Henry Wyche &
George Wyche the Executors my Horses & Mares I leave them to the use of
my Wife & Plantation I order that my Estate may not be ^{up}praised nor
sold but that my Executors may after the Death of my Wife may
Divide my whole Estate Equally Between all my Children that is not
given away in Legacies if I have any Ready Money to be Equally
Divided between my wife & my three sons. Whereas I confirm this & do

other to be my last will & Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto
 Set my Hand & Seal this Day & Year above Written.
