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In the name of God Amen. I Richard Vaughan of Saint Andrews Parish
in the County of Brunswick being in perfect mind and memory tho' weak of
Body do constitute and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament and I
sincerely beleive in the true Messiah and the Resurrection of the Life of the
world to come. Item I desire to my Daughter in Law Loveday Vaughan the
use of my Plantation I now live on during her Life or Widowhood and after
her decease or marriage I desire to my two Grandsons Richard and
Abraham Vaughan the Tract of Land I now live on to be equally divided
across the Beaver Pond Branch to them and their Heirs forever Item I desire
to my Daughter Susanna Feild one Bed and Furniture and one Chest to her
and her Heirs and assigns forever Item I desire to my Daughter Martha
Wall ten Shillings current Money to her and her Heirs and assigns forever

Item I desire to my daughter ~~Mary Pain~~ ten Shillings current money to her
 and her Heirs forever Item I desire to my Grand Sons Richard Vaughan
 and Abraham Vaughan my Negro Fellow named Cripit for the Use and
 Maintenance of the said Children till they come to lawfull age and to them
 and their Heirs and Assigns forever Item I desire to my son Richard Vaughan
 after he has paid all my just Debts my Negro Fellow Jamey with all my Credits
 to him his Heirs and Assigns forever Item I desire to my Grand Children
 David Pain and Mary Pain one son to them and their Heirs forever
 Item I desire the remaining part of Stock that I have not heretofore given to be
 equally divided between my son Abraham Vaughan's Children and my
 Daughter Susanna Seid's Children to them and their and Assigns forever
 Item I constitute and appoint my Friend Henry Embry Senr to be my
 Executor to this my last Will and Testament and my Will is that it may be
 admitted to Record without any Appraisment on any part of my Estate and
 I utterly revoke disallow and disannull all former Wills and Consigning
 this and no other to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my Hand and affixed my Seal this fourteenth Day of January
