Will.

In the name of God Amen the fifteenth Day of January 1749.

I Robert Christie of the parish of Saint Andrews and County of Brunswick being sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God therefore calling to mind the mortallity of my Body and knowing it is appointed for all Flesh once to Die Do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner following first of all I give my Soul into the Hands of God that gave it me in sure and certain hope that at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again and my Body to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as for what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with I give Demise and Dispose in manner following. Inprimis I give and bequeath my Land whereon I now live being two hundred Acres more or less to my two Sons William and Jesse

Christie and their Heirs forever to be equally divided between them
 my two Sons by two Men only my Desire is that my Son William
 and his Heirs have the plantation whereon I now live Item I give
 and bequeath to my Son William my Feather Bed and Furniture
 that I purchased of William Lawrence and my young Mare call'd
 Kate and her Increase and one Cow and calf and Sow and
 Piggs to him and his Heirs forever It I give and bequeath to my
 Daughter Anne and her Heirs forever my young Mare called
 Jonny and her Increase and one Cow and calf and one Sow and
 Piggs Item I give and bequeath to my Son Jesse and his Heirs forever
 my Mare called Bonny and her Increase and one Cow and calf and
 one Sow and Piggs Item I give and bequeath to my loving my young gray
 Mare called Shuttis and her Increase and one Cow and calf and one
 Sow and Piggs Item all the rest my Estate I lend to my loving Wife during
 her natural Life and at her Decease to be equally divided between all my
 children only my Desire is that my Son Jesse have my Feather Bed and

appoint William Samford and John Lamberth my whole and sole
Executors of this my last Will and Testament utterly revoking and
disannulling all other Wills by me made.

At a Court held for Brunswick County the 21 Day of March 1750.
This Will was presented in Court by William Samford one of the Factors
therein named who refused to take upon himself the Burthen of the
Execution thereof Whereupon It was Ordered that the same should
remain in the Clerk's Office of this County and that John Lamberth

the other Executor therein also named should be Summoned to appear
at the next Court and declare whether he will ^{take} upon himself the
Burthen of the Execution or not.

Teste Sterblack bter Cur.

At a Court held for Brunswick County the 25. Day of September 1750.
This Will was proved by the Oaths of Hugh Williams and William
Samberth Jun^r witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and
On the motion of William Samford one of the Executors therein
named who made Oath thereto according to Law Certificate was
granted him for obtaining a Probat thereof in due form he having
given Bond and Security as the Law in such cases directs.
