I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Reifulla Towns the Worth of Ten Shillings. I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Katherine Rogers the Worth of Ten Shillings. I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Bennett the Worth of Ten Shillings. I give and unto my Daughter Mary Procter the Bed and furniture whereon she lies also one Cow and half and Eighteen Shillings in Cash all my Stock that I have not already bequeathed I give to my son Thomas Procter his Heirs and assigns forever all the Rest of my Estate I leave to my loving wife Mary and after her Decese then to descend unto my said Son Thomas his Heirs forever. I give & bequeath unto my Grand Son Joshua Procter five Shillings to be raised out of my Estate after my debts and funeral charge are paid and I do hereby constitute and Ordain my Son Tho. Procter my Whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills by me made and confirming this and this only to be my last Will and Test.
