and calling to Mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is
appointed for all persons once to die do make and ordain this my last Will
and Testament in manner and form following hereby Revoking all
other Will and Testament by me heretofore made first I commend my Soul
into the Hands of God that gave it and as for my Body I commend to the
Earth to be Buried in a Christian manner by my Executor hereafter
named and as touching the disposition of all such Temporal Estate

as it hath been pleased by Almighty God to bestow upon me I
Give Devise Dispose of as followeth Inprimis I will that
my Debts and Funeral Expences be duly paid and discharged
by my Executors. Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son
Daniel Clarke all my Land that is called Cliburns and all
that is above the Round meadows Gut and up the Creek to James
Judkins's Land to the said Daniel Clarke his Heirs and
Assigns forever. Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son
Samuel Clarke two hundred and thirty Acres of Land being
on the South side of Fountains Creek up to William Booth's Land
to him his Heirs and Assigns for ever.
