John Collier whole and Sole Executors to fulfill this my Last Will

and Testament and the remainder part of my Estate not mentioned

after my Lawfull Debts be paid I leave to be Equally Divided between

my two Sons John Collier Thomas Collier In Witness this 29th Day

John having with Nathaniel Collier & Robert Lanier his Sureties

entered into and Acknowledged Bond in the Penalty of five hundred Dollars

with Conditions according to Law, And Liberty is given the other Executors to

join in the Probate when they shall think fit.
