of my Funeral Charges and all my just debts paid.
I bestow and dispose of as Followeth. I give unto

Current Money. I give unto my well beloved son
John Jackson four hundred Acres of Land lying on both
Sides of the Cabins Branch Station & his Heirs or Assigns for
ever. I give to John Jackson a set of Trupors (I mean one

Qst seven Sporns one Inch Augre one two Inch Chisel one
