but of Sound Memory calling to mind the Great uncertainty of our being
~~here~~ have made and ordained this my last will and Testament, I
give and bequeath my Soul to god that gave it Relying on the merits
of my dear Saviours most bitter Death and Passion I shall receive
full remission of all my Sins and my Body to be decently buried
at the Discretion of my Executors Hereafter Named, Item I
give to my son William Adams all my Land & Plantation containing
Two Hundred & Ninety acres to him and the Heirs of his Body if
any and if my son should dye without Heir that my Land should
be equally divided between my Two Daughters Anne Adams &
Priscilla Adams to them and their Heirs forever if any & if my

Two Daughters should live without Love my wife Elisabeth Adams
 shall have my land, Item I give to my son William Adams one
 Negro Girl Named Jane & the Increase of her Body to him and his
 Heirs forever, Item I give to my Daughter Anne Adams one Negro
 Girl Named Sue and the increase of her Body to her and her Heirs
 forever Item I give to my Daughter Priscilla Adams one Negro
 Girl Named Aspa and the Increase of her Body to her and her Heirs
 forever Item I order that my wife Elisabeth Adams shall have the
 use of my three above mentioned negroes Till the term of age or
 married Item I lend to my beloved Wife Elisabeth Adams the
 Part of my Negroes Named Amey & Sarah & Bathsheba and their
 Increase during her life and after the death of my wife to be
 Equally divided between my three Children Item I give to my
 Wife Elisabeth Adams after my debts and funeral charges is paid
 all the rest of my Estate to her & her heirs or assigns, I leave my
 beloved Wife and her Brother John Olney my sole and Sole
 Executor in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
 fixed my Seal this Ninth day of September 1758.
