in Manner Following

I Item. I Give and Bequeath to my son in Law David Lucas and Elizabeth his
wife Two Cows and Calves or Yearlings and fifty Shillings Current money
of Virginia

I Item. I Give and Bequeath unto my son Horvill Collier and his heirs for ever
one Negro Fellow named Cain also one Negro Wench named Hannah the
Stock of Cattle the increase of a mair called Willabe that has been on the
Plantation provided that he will pay and Deliver unto my son Nathaniel
Collier the Old mair and eight head of Cattle young and Old when
Demanded in Case he Refuses or Neglects so to do then my Will is that
my son Nathaniel Collier have the Stock of Cattle herein before given to my
son Horvill Likewise the increase of the mair before mentioned I also Give
him the Cows Cattle and that he hath now in ^{otherwise he hath had now in his possession} ~~possession~~ my Will is that it
be sold and the money Equally Divided Between my Two sons Horvill &
Nathaniel I also Give him one Large Stone Jug

I Item. I Give and Bequeath unto ^{my son} ~~my son~~ Horvill Collier and his heirs for ever one Negro
Fellow named Great Dick one Negro Girl named Hannah eight Head of
Cattle young and Old Ten head of Hogs and Twenty Pounds Current
Money of Virginia Likewise

Mem. I Give And Bequath to my son Nathaniel Collier and his heirs for ever
the Upper half of my Tract of land in Lunenburg County on Duck
Creek the other half which I have made over to my son Horrell Corl
among about Three Hundred and Twenty Acres each here in before
mentioned have been Divided by me with a straight line one the
Creek at a white Oak thence to the head of Whitstone Branch to Tree
black Jacks one Negro Teller named Jack one Negro Girl named
Tabb the eight head of Cattle that my son Horrell is to Deliver him
and likewise the main half of my Hogs on my Plantation on
- on Nehemiah a new ^{Iron} Virginia Pick to fill with new Irons
- that is in the House his Rugg Blankets and a new shirt a horse
Colled snip wide saddle and Bowing four pointer Dishes and six pointer
Plates six pointer spoons three Chears two Leather Bottom the other
Brush Bottom one new Chest one small Iron pot one ^{gun} called hipson half
the Black Walcott Blank that is half my coat ~~that~~ at shewing one
Tying pan and Twelve pounds current money of Virginia one
Drawing knife one Gallon Tugg likewise the fifth Part of Tobacco
made on my plantation in the year 1759.

2. I Give And Bequath to my son in Law James Harrison and Sarah his wife During
their Natural Lives my Negro Woman Sue and her Child Ben and after
their Decease I Give And Bequath them to be Equally Divided
amongst their Children Children Lawfully begotten by their bodies
Together to them and their heirs for ever them and their heirs one
man and call the man called Ben.

Three Cows and Calves or yearlings four head of Hogs one Porcelain
Dish one small trunk one small Brass Kettle and five Pounds
current money of Virginia

Item. I Give and Bequath unto my son Moses Cottier Two Negroes Named
Roger and Phillis to him and his heirs for ever Likewise five
Hundred Acres of Land it being the Tract I now live on to him
and his heirs for ever Likewise the Bed I now lie on and a
new Green Rugg with a good Blankett and Sheet a Man Called
Diggin with a bridle and saddle eight head of Cattle Young and
old Ten head of Hogs four Sheep four Porcelain Dishes Six Plates Six
one Iron pot Two Leather Bottom Chairs one Rush Bottom one Chest
one Gun Called mine one Stone Sugg Six Glasse Bottles one Book Called
the Six Considerations Upon Charity one hand saw one Drawing knife
one Porcelain Bason one ^{quar} pot

Item. I Give and Bequath unto my son Dway Cottier Three Hundred eighty
and four Acres of Land Lying and being on lanes Swamp and
Two Negroes Named Honeyball and Phill to him and his heirs for

Item. I Give and bequath to my son Frederick Cottier fore Negroes George
James Little Dick and Lucy to him and his heirs for ever

Item. I Give and Bequath unto my son William Cottier my Tract of Land

Item. I Give and Bequeath unto my son Nathaniel Collier my Tract of Land on the North Side of Ashursting in Brunswick County Containing Three Hundred Twenty eight Acres to him and his Heirs for ever With all the Stock of Cattle and eleven Barrells of Corn and half the Stock of the Other half of which I have Given before to my son Nathaniel also Three Negroes Named Beck Rob and Nan my will that the Plantation on the said Land with the Stock of Cattle and Hogs and the eleven Barrells of Corn be Rented Out to the Highest bidder not for to work more than Two hands a year and for to keep good Fencing with good Bonds and Securities for the Delivery of all when my son William Come to the age of eighteen I also Give to my son to him and his Heirs for ever one Negro Boy Named Backus

Item. I Appoint my three sons Horace Collier and my son Nathaniel Collier and my son Moses Collier Whole and Sole Executors to fulfill this my last Will and Testament and the Remainder Part of my estate now Mentioned after my Lawfull Debts be paid I Give to be (by ally) Divided Between my three sons Frederick Collier (Deceased) and William Collier GIVEN under my hand this 13th Days November 1759.
