Brunswick being very Sick and weak but of sound and perfect
Mind and Memory do make and Ordain this my last Will and
Testament in the manner and form following. Imprimis, I give
and devise unto my loving Wife Chastity Denton one Feather Bed
and Furniture and one Horse together with all my other Estate Real
and Personal to my said Wife Chastity to her and her Heirs forever
except one Feather Bed which is now in Possession of my Mother
and after the Death of my said Mother I desire my Daughter Lucy
may have it of which said Estate I make and appoint my said
wife Chastity Denton my only and sole Executor. Item I will
and appoint that my said Estate shall not be appraised and

that my Coexecutor shall not be obliged to give any Security ~
In witness of this my said last Will and Testament I have ~
hereunto set my Hand and seal this sixth Day of February 1753.
