Andrew in the County of Brunswick being very sick and
weak in body but of perfect memory and mind and
calling to mind the uncertainty of this Transitory Life do
make and ordain this my last will and Testament and first of
all I recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and
for my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried at the discretion
of my Executors and for my Temporal Estate I dispose of the same
as followeth **My will is** I give and bequeath unto Lucia my
dearly beloved wife the bed that her father gave her together with
all my household Goods except one bed and furniture and my bay
horse called Davis and my bridle and Saddle and a gang of hogs
called the house bird gang and one red cow with a motly face
called motly and a red and white py'd calf that belongs to her.

called the house wiv gang and one red bon with a motly face
called Motly and a red and white py'd calf that belongs to the
bon a small red and white py'd heifer called Tiney and a red and
white py'd bon called pie and her calf during her life and my
will and Desire is that she may live quietly on my plantation
During her widowhood. **Item** I give to my son Peter Jackson
the Tract of Land that I now live on to him and his heirs forever
Item and for the rest of my Estate to be Equally Divided between
my two Children after all my Just debts are paid and allowed and
I do likewise constitute make and Ordain my brother Thomas
Jackson and my brother in law Joseph Tatum Executors of this my
last will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke
and annul all and every other former Testaments wills and
Legacies bequests and Executors by me in any wise fore this time
Named willed and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this
and no other to be my last will and Testament. **IN**
