constitute ordain and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and
form following reciting and amending by these presents all and every Teste-
or Testaments Will and wills heretofore by me made and declared either by a
word or Writing and this to be taken only for my last Will and Testament and
none other and first being penitent and sorry from the bottom of my heart for all
my sins first most humbly desirr forgivness for the same; I give and commit
my soul to Almighty God my saviour and in whose and by the merits of Jesus
Christ I trust and believe apoundly to be saved and to have full emprise and
forgiveness of all my sins and that my soul will with my Body at a general
day of Resurrection shall rest again with Joy and through the merits of Christ
Death and Passion professe and inherit the Kingdom of Heaven prepared for his
elect and chosen and my Body to be buried in such place where it shall please my
Executor hereafter named to appoint And now for the settling of Temporal Estate
and such goods and chattels and debts as it hath pleased God

my debts to be stans upon me I do order you and dispossess the same in manner
and form following that is to say first I will that all these debts and dues as I
am in Right and conscience to any maner of person or persons shall be contented
and paid or adained to be paid within convenient time after my decease by
my Executors hereafter named Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son William
Short one Negro fellow named Pompey to him and his Heirs for ever Item I
give and Bequeath unto my Son Jacob Short one negro fellow named Hannibal
to him and his Heirs for ever as also the land I now or after his Mothers Death
Item I give and Bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Rebecca Abornally
one Negro Child named Whely or five pounds back to her and her Heirs for ever
Item I lend all the rest of my estate to my wife during her Natural life
and after her decease to be equally divided amongst all my Sons and Daughters
Item I do appoint my Son William Short Jacob Short and Charles Abornally
my Executors of this my last Will and Testament as witness my hand and
Seal this day and year above written
