In the Name of God Amen I William Tomlinson of Brunswick County being Very Sick and Weak in Body but of Sound Mind and Memory do hereby certify that on the Day of February in the Year of our Lord one Thousand seven Hundred & Fifty eight, Make and Publish this My Last Will and Testament in Manner following that is to say First I Give to my said Son Tomlinson two Hundred and a fifteen Acres of Land More or less Whereon the Mill Standeth and all that belongs to the said Mill to him & his Heirs forever I also Give him a Horse Coll my Saddle Housen & one Ale two Sows & piggs two Cows & Calves two Sheep five Gees one long gunn & my Crookers & one One Chest a Whet saw & Hand saw Ten Quart Bottles a pair Hens & Coop one Cow a carpenters Add one Feather Bed & Furniture two Chairs two Augers a grubbing hoe two Iron Wedges two Chains two Plain Irons two Axes & two Iron hatts two pewter Dishes four plates & eight spoons I also Give to my Daughter Ann Tomlinson one Feather Bed & Furniture one Cow & calf two Sheep five Gees one Pine Table one Quart Pot & a pair of Hand Bellows one Iron Kettle & a Prognit one large pewter Dish & four plates & eight spoons I also Give to my Daughter Mary Tomlinson one Feather Bed & Furniture one Cow & calf two Sheep five Gees one large Dish four plates & eight spoons a side Saddle one small Box & a green pott two Iron hatts & pott Hooks I also Give to my son William Tomlinson the plantation I now live on Containing two Hundred & fifteen Acres of Land More or less to him & his Heirs forever one Case of Bottles one large Chest one Tumbrel two Cows & Calves one Short gunn a Cuttock Box & Bayonet two Sharp five Gees one brose cut saw and Hand saw a Hogs head Joyster & a pott and a pair of large Compasses a Howell two Chisells two Axes two Augers a grubbing hoe one Yoke & Mare as & her increase two Iron hatts two pewter Dishes four plates & eight spoons

young Mare that I have given to my son William for the use of

Man) Executors of this My Last Will and Testament in Trust for
the Interest and purposes in this my Will contained In Witness
Whereof I the said William Tomlinson have to this my Last Will and
Testament Sett my Hand and Seal the Day and Year above Written
Signed Seated and Delivered by the said William Tomlinson as and
for his Last Will & Testament in the presence of us Who were present
