Mosley, dec^d, was this day produced in Court, and proved by the oaths of L. B. Hanes and M. E. Hodson, the subscribing witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And there being no Executor named in said Will, on the motion of W^m A. Jones, Letters of Administration with the said Will annexed, on the estate of the said Richard T. Mosley, dec^d, are granted him, he having taken the oath required by law, and with Joseph C. Morgan, his security entered into, and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of \$150. conditioned according to law. Security sworn to justify.
