age, and of sound mind and disposing memory, do make and con-
stitute this to be my last Will and Testament, revoking all others.

Examined

1st It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid.
2nd I give and bequeath the land on which I reside including
the mansion house and the other buildings attached thereto, to my
wife during her life. I also give and bequeath to my wife during
her life the following named slaves, Daniel, Eliza, Ben. (Beverly)
Sophia and Lucinda; also one ox cart, one yoke of oxen, three
horses, and two milch cows.

3rd My son Willbourn Neighbours has had his full share
of my estate heretofore.

4th I give and bequeath to my son Robert Neighbours one
negro man called Aaron.

5th To my son Alexander Neighbours I confirm this deed that

and
I made to him for two hundred and eighteen acres of land called the by-lanes
tract, also one negro man (George) also one feather bed and furniture
and one cow and calf. I have paid at different times for my son Al-
exander the sum of about one thousand dollars, which I give up to
him provided he brings no account against my estate, and in the
event that he does, then for him to account for the thousand doll-
ars to the legatee.

6th I give to my son Thomas Neighbour the land on which I
reside at his mother's death, also Pinc, Phil, and Sam, also at his
mother's death I give him Lucinda and her two youngest children,
(Ellen and Tom) with her increase from this time, also one yoke
apex, one milch cow, and one feather bed and furniture.

7th I give and bequeath to my daughter Almira Neighbour
two negro girls (Adeline and Betty) also one milch cow, one feather
bed and furniture, if she should die without legal issue then her
portion of my estate to fall into the hands of my son Thomas,
as trustee for the benefit of my granddaughter Henrietta C. More-
ley. It is also my will that Almira shall have a negro girl
(Rose) and that she continue to live with her mother during her
singlehood without board.

8th I give to my grand daughter Henrietta C. Moreley the
following slaves Little Sophia, Little Lucy, Jane, Ben and Mary,
also the household furniture that belongs to her mother. I appoint
my son Thomas to act as her trustee.

9th It is my will and desire that all of my slaves not
otherwise bequeathed and not of those that came by my wife shall
be equally divided among my three daughters Mary, Almira
and Thomas.

9th It is my will and desire that all of my
otherwise bequeathes among my three daughters Mary, Abigail and
Catherine and their children and also that the slaves that came
by my wife, and not otherwise bequeathes shall be equally di-
vided among all of my children and their heirs at her death.

10th It is my will and desire that my son Thomas Neigh-
bours shall continue to live with his mother, free from board, during
her life, and if he and his mother from any cause should disa-
gree, then and in that case for him to have two hundred and fifty
acres of land that I now live on, laid off to him adjoining his
brother Alexander's.

11th I give to my daughter Catherine Miller one hundred
and thirty acres of my Rock Island Creek tract of land, and the
balance to be sold and the money equally divided among my
daughters Mary, Abigail and my grand daughter Herietta L.
Mondy, 12th Lastly I appoint my son Thomas Neighbours and Mary
James M. Patterson my Executors to this my last Will and Testament
In witness whereof I hereunto subscribe my name this twenty
fourth day of April 1850.
