And thereupon the said Will is ordered to be recorded. And at another day, to wit: At a County Court continued and held for said County, November 14th 1876. On the motion of Ann E. Garden the Executrix named in said Will, who made oath thereto, and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of \$1000. conditioned according to law, without security, the testator by his Will directing that none should be required, certificate is granted the said Executrix for obtaining a probat of the said Will in due form.
