Talley dec^d, and verily believe that the said Will and the signature thereto subscribed are wholly in the handwriting of the said B. N. Talley dec^d. Whereupon the same is ordered to be recorded as the last Will and Testament of B. N. Talley, dec^d.

And in the motion of Geo. B. Nicholas, a son of Philip N. Nicholas and an ~~officer~~ ^{officer} under the said Will, Letters of Administration on the estate of the said B. N. Talley dec^d are granted Philip N. Nicholas, he having made oath thereto, and with E. M. Hubbard, his security, the Court deeming him sufficient, he having been sworn to justify, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Six Hundred Dollars, payable to the Commonwealth and conditioned according to law, certificate is granted the said Philip N. Nicholas for obtaining a probat of said Will in due form.
