At a Court held for Buckingham County, August 9th 1869. This day this paper writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Baker W. Davidson, ~~was~~ ~~was~~ produced in Court, and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto, George D. Saunders and James O. Gillispie were sworn who testified that they are well acquainted with the handwriting of the testator, and verily believe the said writing and the name thereto subscribed to be wholly written by the testator's own hand whereupon the said writing or order is to be recorded. And on the motion of Ann H. Davidson, the Executrix therein named, who made oath thereto, and together with Matthew A. Coof, N.C. Pougham, and J. P. Gillispie, her securities, entered into and acknowledged ~~in~~ in the penalty of \$1000. conditions according to law, certificate is granted her for obtaining a probat of said will in due form. And the estate of the said decedent being declared to be of less value than \$1000. no revenue stamp is required.
