I also desire that the children by her first husband be equal with mine in the division of my property both real and personal, & I hereby appoint my said wife Caroline sole executrix to manage & do as she pleases with my said estate, & I hereby request that the Court will not require of her any security & I have hereunto set my hand & seal this the 24<sup>th</sup> day of August eighteen hundred and eighty nine.
