I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Julia W. Ragland all my Goods & Chattels both real & Personal of every description, to have & to hold forever for her undivided benefit & to do as she chooses to do with at her death. Should she out live myself I further give & bequeath to her all evidences of Beasts due me or that may become due to me from what ever source & I further give & bequeath to her my said wife any & all legacies that may be coming to me from any source. Whatever & the reason I do this I don't

want her to be dependent in her old age should she out live myself & for fear some of my kin people would turn her out doors if they could & I don't want that done for she worked hard & helped me to make what I have of this world's goods & I do declare this to be my last will & testament In testimony whereof I the said testator David W. Ragland have to this my said last will written upon one sheet of Paper set my hand & seal this the 14th day of June one thousand eight hundred & ninety seven (1897)
