Eldridge, being of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this as my last will and testament - I give all my estate both real and personal to be equally divided between my three children Mildred M. Eldridge Mary P. Eldridge and Benj R. Eldridge subject to the following proviso I wish the place on which I now live to be a home for my two daughters Mildred and Mary should either of them marry, then to be a home for the one who is sole and unmarried - I wish my son Benj R. Eldridge and wife to have a home here whenever he chooses to make it as such, wishing at the same time my unmarried daughter or daughter as it may be to have the control of the home as long as either of them are single.

It is my wish that my three children, out of my estate should give their father a decent and necessary support and a home at the place I now live on during his life.

I hereby appoint my son B. R. Eldridge Executor of this my last will & desire that he be allowed to qualify without giving security.
