I give my niece George Ann Nich. as the following slaves to wit: Paddy, Lucy, Nancy, Julia Harriet and Fanny. I give to my niece Francis Nicholas my slave Betty. I give to my nephew Robert L. Nicholas my slave David. I give to my nephew John Scott Nicholas my slave George. I give to my nephew George W. Nicholas my slave Step. I give to my sister Molly Rose one fourth part of whatever money may be due me. I give to my brother Joshua one fourth part of whatever

money may be due me. I give to the children of my brother George one fourth part of whatever money may be due me. I give to the children of my brother Robert one fourth part of whatever money may be due me. I also give them my slave Rachael and her child. It is my Will and desire that my slave Jacob may be emancipated trusting that he may for his good behaviour and faithful service be permitted to remain in the State. It is my desire that no appraisement of my estate should take place. I lastly appoint Charles A. Scott Executor of this my last Will and Testament. Signed and sealed this third day of February 1823

Bocock, Daniel Guernant and Fleming Turner Gentlemen Justices of the Court of Buckingham County now sitting in the just and full sum of Twenty thousand Dollars. To the payment whereof well and truly to be made to the said Justice and their successors, we bind ourselves, and each of us, our, and each of our heirs, executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated this 12th day of March 1823 and in the 47th year of our foundation. The condition of the above obligation is such, that if the said Charles A. Scott executor of Elizabeth Nicholas deceased, do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of him the said Charles A. Scott or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him the said Charles A. Scott and the same so made do exhibit into the said County Court at such time as he shall be thereto required by the said Court, and the same goods, chattels and credits do well and truly administer according to law; and make a just and true account of all his actings and doings thereon when thereunto required by the said Court, and further do well and truly pay and deliver all the legacies contained and specified in the said Will as far as the goods, chattels and credits will extend according to the value thereof, and as the law shall charge
