This paper writing was returned into Court, together with the Commission thereto annexed for taking the attestation of Maria H. Brown a witness thereto, and the certificate under the hand of J. C. Haines, a Justice of the Peace, of the execution of the said Commission, and thereupon the said Certificate being seen and inspected by the Court, it is ordered that the said writing be recorded as the true Last Will and Testament of William Guernant dec'd. And at another day to wit, At a County Court held for said County, July 13th 1874. On the motion of Hetty Guernant, the Executrix named in said Will, who made oath thereto and entered into and acknowledges a bond conditioned according to law without security, the testator by his Will directing that none should be required, certificate is granted the said Hetty J. Guernant for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form.

2^d I give to my brothers Beverly T. Mof. and John P. Mof. all the real estate I may possess and request further that no money due me by either of my brothers shall be collected from them as I give each of them all money due me.

I appoint my brother William A. Mof. Executor to see that the provisions ^{of this} will in carried out and request his acceptance of the same. Amen.

At a County Court continued and held for Buckingham County, January 13th 1874. This paper writing, purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Francis Coleman Mof. dec^d was this day produced in Court, and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto Robert P. Shaw Jr and Wm P. Hall were sworn who testified that they are well acquainted with the hand writing of the testator, and they verily believe the said writing and the name thereto subscribed to be wholly written by the testator's own hand whereupon the said writing is ordered to be recorded as the true last Will and Testament of said Francis C. Mof. dec^d. And on the motion of Wm A. Mof. the Executor named in said Will, who made oath thereto and with P. A. Forbes his security, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of \$2500. payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia and conditioned according to law (security sworn to justify) certificate is granted the said Wm A. Mof. for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form.
