This my last will and Testament I, Francis O'Bryant being of sound mind but in feeble health - First I give unto my wife Judith A. O'Bryant all of my real estate and personal property to her during her life for her to use in any manner she may think proper for a support.

Second - After her death I give unto my son B. W. O'Bryant the tract of land known as Rakes containing one hundred and forty four acres to him as his portion of my estate in consideration of his services to me.

Third - After the death of my wife Judith A. O'Bryant I wish for my son Thomas H. O'Bryant to administer upon my estate and to sell all of the real estate and personal property to the highest bidder and to pay first out of the proceeds one hundred dollars apiece to each of my two daughters Sarah E. O'Bryant and Laura A. Lyndsey and the remainder to be equally divided between my children. And if my son Thomas fails to qualify as administrator then I want my son John H. O'Bryant to administer and proceed as above mentioned.
