I give and devise to my beloved wife Mary Shephard for and during her natural life all the balance of my real estate, also all of my household and kitchen furniture of every kind and description, all of my horses, mules, cattle, sheep, hogs, farming implements, wagons, plows, hoes with all gear of every kind, spring wagon or buggy if I should have one at my death. My said wife may sell any or all of the personal estate for her necessary maintenance for food or clothing or for both. At the death of my wife I give and devise the whole of my real and personal estate that may be left to my son Doctor R. Shephard. If my wife survive my son Doctor then I want the whole of my real and personal estate equally divided between my son Sarah and my son Frank. I am owing my son George Shephard fifty (50) dollars and my son Frank I am owing my son George Shephard fifty (50) dollars.
