

I George W. Kyle of Buckingham County do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following to-wit:

1st I direct that a part of my land to be sold from the upper end of my tract when a fair price can be obtained beginning the north side of Willis where my crop fence joins Wm D Jones near a gate keeping the said crop fence to my back fence on the south side of Willis thence a straight line to Capt E J Williams line for the purpose of paying any debt that may come against me and if no debt should come then equally divided among my grand children.

2nd I give to my daughter Mary C Kyle with every thing I possess the balance of my my land on which my dwelling house barn tobacco houses table and all outhouses stands with all my stock of every House hold furniture, Kitchen ditto plantation tools If I have forgotten any thing I also give it to my said daughter no matter at what time of the year I may die I also give my daughter Mary aforesaid the crops on hand and growing at my death upon condition that she is to give my wife Kyle a home in my house board her and clothe her so long as she may live.

3rd I appoint my son David W. my Executor and is not required to give security I wish it understood that it is my desire to give my daughter Mary C Kyle every thing I possess on her complying with the condition Witness my hand this 21st March 1866.

Kyle with every thing I possess the balance of my my land on which my welling house barn tobacco houses table and all outhouses stands with all my stock of every House hold furniture, Kitchen ditto plantation tools If I have forgotten any thing I also give it to my said daughter no matter at what time of the year I may die I also give my daughter Mary aforesaid the crops on hand and growing at my death upon condition that she is to give my wife Kyle a home in my house board her and clothe her so long as she may live.

3rd I appoint my son David M. my Executor and is not requires to give security I wish it understood that it is my desire to give my daughter Mary C. Kyle every thing I posses on her complying with the conditions Witness my hand this 21st March 1866.

At a Court held for Buckingham County September 14th 1874. This paper coming purporting to be the last Will and Testament of George M. Kyle, dec^d was this day produced in Court, and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto, Grandson son Charles and Robert B. Shaw Jr were sworn who testified that they are well acquainted with the testator's handwriting, and verily believe the said writing and the name thereto subscribed to be wholly written by the testator's own hand where upon the said writing is ordered to be recorded as the true last Will and Testament of the said George M. Kyle, dec^d and David M. Kyle the Executor named in said Will, refusing to take upon himself the burden of the execution thereof, on the motion of Mary C. Kyle. Letter of administration on the estate of the said George M. Kyle, dec^d are granted her she having made oath said Will and with

Richard H. Williams and Peter A. Forbes, his guardian, entered into an agreement to
bond in the penalty of \$1000. conditions according to law.

the said James H. Farley may desire, free from any charge of rent whatever.
Lastly, I nominate and appoint my beloved husband J. H. Farley executor
of this my last Will and Testament and request that the Court will allow him to
qualify without security.
