I, Gillis Keister being of sound mind and disposing memory do make this my last will, as follows to wit: I give to my son William B. Keister all of my real estate for and during his life, and at his death to be equally divided between his lawful heirs. I also give to my said son William all of my personal, and mixed property of every kind and description absolutely: I appoint my said son my executor and request the court admitting this my last will to record, to permit him to qualify without security. This from no want of natural love and affection for my other children that I give them no portion of my property, but as my said son William has aided me for some years, & I expect him to continue to do so as long as I live, I think it but just to compensate him for his kindness to me and his mother as far as I am able. Witness my hand and seal this the 21st day of March 1879.
