

I, Goodrich Sanders of the County of Buckingham and State of Virginia, do make and ordain this writing to be my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following to wit:

Item 1st I direct all my just debts to be paid, and for this purpose, I direct my negro girl Franky to be sold by my executor.

Item 2. I give to my daughter Sally Ann Neighbors five slaves named Hemzella, Broughton, Mary, Amanda, and Edith, and the future increase of the females, and one cow and calf, to her sole and separate use, to be in no manner subject to the debts or contracts of her husband, and to be disposed of by her by deed or last Will and Testament as she may think proper.

Item 3. I give to my son Wm K Sanders the tract of Land on which I now reside, seven slaves named Randolph, Dick, Heires, Susan, Isaac, Berry and Tamar, and the future increase of the females, one ox cart and yoke of oxen, a roan horse, and a white mare, and the crop on hand at my death.

Item 4th I give to my son John D. Sanders my tract of land called Bindersants and four slaves named Dick, Stephen, Jack and Julia her future increase, a mule colt, a one horse waggon and two cows.

Item 5th I direct my household and kitchen furniture and my sheep to be equally divided between my said two sons Wm K and John D. Sanders.

Item 6th All the rest and residue of my estate, except any increase of my slaves between the date of this my Will and my death, I give to my said son Wm K Sanders.

Item 7th Should the slave Franky set apart in the first clause of this Will be insufficient for the payment of my debts, then I direct that the balance of said debts shall be paid by my said three children, each to pay a third of said debts, and I charge their respective legacies with the payment of the same.

And, lastly, I appoint Alex. Mosely executor of this my last Will and Testament. Witness my hand and seal this 14th day of August 1863.

This paper purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Goodrich Saunders dec'd. with a codicil annexed, was this day produced in Court and proved the Will by the oath of Alex. Mosley, and the codicil by the oath of Alex. Mosley and W. H. Dummerant, subscribing witnesses thereto. And at another Court held for said County Decr. 12, 1864. The said Will was further proved by the oath of W. M. Drumballer, a subscribing witness, and thereupon the said Will and Codicil are ordered to be recorded. And on the petition of Alex. Mosley, the executor named in said Will, who made oath thereto and entered into

and acknowledged bond with security, conditioned according to law, certificate is
granted the said executor for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.
