My Will

In the name of God Amen. I Humphrey O. Pritchard of the County of Buckingham State of Virginia being of sound mind & memory and realizing the uncertainty of life and being desirous how my property shall be disposed of after my decease, do make & ordain this as my last will and testament. My will is that,

1st My funeral expenses & all of my just debts be paid out of my estate.

2nd I give unto wife Martha Pritchard my residence & land near Arvonia where she now resides during her widowhood. At her marriage or death to go to my son David O. Pritchard.

3rd I give unto my son Humphrey O. Pritchard the sum of one dollar.

4th I give unto my son David O. Pritchard the residue of my estate all property real and personal or mixed of whatsoever kind, I may die seized or possessed or to which I may be entitled to at the time of my decease.

5th I also appoint my son David O. Pritchard to be my executor without giving any bond or security. In testimony whereof I Humphrey O. Pritchard have to this my last will and testament subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 28th day of July in the year of our Lord 1894. All this in my own hand writing.

At a County Court held for Buckingham County, Virginia, on the 11th day of March 1882.
This paper writing purporting to be the last will and testament of Humphrey D. Pritchard, dec'd, was this day produced in Court, and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto, David J. Morgan and David D. Pritchard were sworn, and severally deposed that they are well acquainted with the testator, and do truly believe the said handwriting and the same to be wholly written by the testator's own hand. Whereupon the Court ordered the said writing to be recorded as the true last will and testament of the said Humphrey D. Pritchard, dec'd. And on the petition of David D. Pritchard, the executor named in said will, who made oath thereto, and returned into Court and acknowledged on bond in the penalty of \$1200⁰⁰ without security, the testator directing by his will that none should be required, certificate is granted the said executor for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.
