I James Garrett of said County do make this my last Will and Testament revoking all others heretofore made by me

1st To avoid any litigation or contention after my death in regard to any property that is now in my possession or that I may hereafter become possessor of, I will to my wife Paulina O. Garrett the following property viz. two horses and their increase three cows and increase all the hogs and increase one waggon and one buggy and all the plantation utensils &c all the household and kitchen furniture all bond & accounts that is due or hereafter become due and all money that may be in mine or her possession at my death

2^d I desire that all the crops that may be on hand and all the crops that may be growing and not matured at my death to be equally divided between my wife and my son James F. Garrett in testimony I hereunto affix my hand and seal this the 20th day of November 1872
