First, I desire that all ^{of} my just debts be paid by my executing herein after named as soon as convenient.

Secondly, I give to my beloved wife Ann Eliza Garden all of my estate real and personal and mines including any interest which I may have in the estate of her father John Brooks by virtue of my intermarriage with her also any interest which I may have in the estate of my father Thos. J. Garden to be at her entire disposal either by Will or deed.

Thirdly, I appoint my said wife Executrix of this my last Will and Testament and desire that the Court in which she may qualify as such shall require of her no security for the administration of my estate, given under my hand this the eighteenth day of March, Eighteen Hundred and Sixty one.

At a County Court held for Buckingham County, July 10th 1876. This paper writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of John B. Garden, did on this day produced in Court and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto, Ira P. Brooks and James A. Wright were sworn who testified that they are well acquainted with the handwriting of the testator and truly believe the said writing and the name thereto subscribed to be wholly written by the testator's own hand. And thereupon the said Will is ordered to be recorded. And at another day, to wit: At a County Court continued and held for said County, November 18th 1876. On the motion of Ann E. Garden, the Executrix named in said Will, who made oath thereto, and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of \$1000 conditioned

And thereupon the said Will is ordered to be recorded. And at another day, to wit: At a County Court continued and held for said County, November 10th 1876. On the motion of Ann E. Garden, the Executrix named in said Will, who made oath thereto, and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of \$1000 conditioned according to law, without security, the testator by his Will directing that none should be required, certificate is granted the said Executrix for obtaining a probat of the said Will in due form.
