I do hereby constitute my said wife my lawful executrix to carry out the purposes of this will, and it is my desire that she shall not be required to give a bond for her faithful execution of her duty.

And on the motion of Sarah Jane Fisher, the executrix named in said will, who made oath thereto, and entered into and acknowledged to bond in the penalty of \$1,000.⁰⁰ without security, the testator by his will directing that no bond should be required, which the Court construes to mean that no security should be required - Certificate is granted the said Sarah Jane Fisher for obtaining a probate of the said will and codicil in due form.
