Then I give a certain parcel of land in the same County to Caroline Going and her heirs the said line to start on the mill road at a large Spanish Oak tree on the lower side of the road leading to Epps old dower down to chestnut oak tree thence straight along to the Court House road thence back to the Spanish Oak tree

Then the remainder of the said land to be equally divided be the said John C. Quill and Samuel A. Garrett. But the said John Garrett and wife shall have possession of the said land their lifetime.
