Second. I desire all of my just debt to be paid.

Third. I give and bequeath to my children, and their heirs as follows viz. The one third of my property which the law sets aside for the use and benefit of my wife Elizabeth Spencer, during her natural life shall go at her death to my daughter Eliza wife of Robt W Spencer.

Fourth. The remaining two thirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) shall be divided as follows, to my sons Chas. A. Spencer, John J. Spencer, Henry Spencer, Sam Spencer, and to my daughter Eliza, wife of Robt W. Spencer, one sixth part each, making five ($\frac{5}{6}$) sixths in all, and the remaining sixth to be equally divided between Mrs Mary P. Shephard wife of B. G. Shephard and Francis E. Shephard wife of Sam Shephard or their heirs, (they having received at my hands more than my other children during my lifetime).

Fifth. It is my will and desire that my friend J. B. Lytle Team shall be the Executor of this my last Will and Testament which I hereunto set my hand and seal this 9th day of September 1889.
