Item 1st I will and devise that all my just debts be paid.

Item 2^d I will and devise that all my Demingo place containing two hundred and seventy nine acres more or less situated on Hunts Creek in the County of Buckingham to my wife Susan S. Williams during her life and at her death to be equally divided between her Brother S. W. Farrar and his sister Pauline E. Ould.

Item 3^d I will and devise my Wheeler place to my Sister Isabella Ayers during her life and at her death to John M. Farrar Son of S. W. Farrar.

I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Susan S. Farrar Executrix of this my last will and testament, and request that she may be permitted to qualify without giving security.

This paper writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of John Williams, do on this day produced in Court, and partly proved by the oath of Samuel W. Farrar one of the subscribing witnesses thereto, and R. C. Huckle the other subscribing witness to the same Will.

being dead, his handwriting was proved by the oath of Johnson Nichols, and it was proved to the Court that the name Susan E. Parker (instead of Susan E. Williams) written in the body of said Will wherein the said Testator constituted and appointed his wife the said Susan E. Williams as the Executrix of his said will was only a clerical error. Whereupon the said Will was ordered to be recorded as the true last Will and Testament of the said John Williams, dec'd.

And as witness of said Susan E. Williams, the Executrix named in said Will, who made oath thereto, and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of \$100. conditioned according to law, without security, the Testator requesting in his said Will that none should be required of her, certificate is granted the said Susan E. Williams for obtaining a probate of said Will in due form.

examines In the name of God Amen: I, Joseph Stinson, being of sound mind do make this my last will and testament on this 9th day of December 1895. First:- I give and bequeath to my daughter, Francis Elizabeth, all that part and parcel of land known by the name of "Pate" adjoining the lands of Waller L. Hammer and George Patterson in the County of Buckingham Virginia containing 225 acres more or less. I give and bequeath to her this tract of land during her lifetime to revert to the estate after her death.

Secondly:- I give and bequeath all other lands I may die possessed of to my children to be equally among them or the heirs of their body.

Thirdly:- I give and bequeath their mother's portion of my estate to my grand Children Edwin and Kemper Baker and Fannie Clark to be equally divided between them.

Fourthly:- I give and bequeath all my household furniture and personal property to Francis Elizabeth my daughter.

Fifthly I appoint James H. Logan and John L. Stinson to qualify my Executors to qualify without security.
