

The last Will of Louis H. Hurt I Louisa H. Hurt considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory do make and constitute this my last Will and Testament in form following viz

Item I give to my son Frank Hurt fifty acres of land and one bed

Item I give to my son Robert Hurt fifty acres of land and one bed

Item I give to my daughter Clementine Cook five acres of land to be cut off so as to include the house which her husband had erected

Item I give to my daughter Henningham Hurt seven acres of land with the provision that the dwelling house is to be the joint property of her and her two brothers Frank and Robert as long as she remains single should she marry her right in the house expires and it belongs to the two brothers

Item I give to my daughter Mary L. Marks five acres of land and a milk cow

The stock I desire shall remain on the place
