- 3 I give to my nephew W. L. Fontaine my entire interest in my sister Catherine's estate
- 4 I give to my niece Margaret M. Brown one third of my estate and all of my Chamber furniture
- 5 I give to my nieces Annice & Nicholas Calverton of Buckingham and my nephew J. W. Thompson \$600. to be divided between them
- 6 I give to all of my Brother W. S. Fontaine's children my interest in his estate
- 7 I give to my sister Eliza F. Scruggs Patten V. Fontaine and my brother C. R. Fontaine the balance of my estate
- 8 I wish the bonds of my brother C. R. Fontaine held by me to be delivered to him as fully paid
- 9 I hereby nominate and appoint my brother C. R. Fontaine executor of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I do here

I do hereby sign my name and affix my seal on this the 25 of June in the year 1888
