

Buckingham County, Va.

March 21st 1890.

I, Maria J. Duvant of the County of Buckingham State of Virginia, being of sound mind and disposing memory and aware of the approach of life and the certainty of death, do make and publish this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all others, if any, heretofore made by me to wit -

Item 1. I wish and direct that twelve acres of my land, lying N.E. of my residence and adjoining the land of Wm Lockett Col^d be sold to pay my debts.

Item 2. I bequeath to my daughter Mary J. Yancey, during her life and at her death to her children one half of my land, after deducting the said twelve acres.

Item 3. I bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth B. Meads the balance of my land with dwelling being about ninety two acres after deducting the said twelve acres and the half bequeathed to my said daughter Mary J. Yancey with this arrangement - The said Elizabeth B. Meads agreeing that Garrison George and his wife Eliza to have the use of five acres of the said Elizabeth the first during their natural lives.

Item 4. I bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth B. Meads all the rest and residue of my estate consisting of whatever it may.

C. Coleman, also all property of any kind that I may hereafter possess or become heir to.
I bequeath to the above named Sister A. C. Coleman I wish it to be understood that in
the event of the death of my Sister Arianna C. Coleman before my death that I leave
my dear Brother John R. Coleman here to all of my property as above mentioned both per-
sonal and Real and all property of every kind that may belong to me at any time
in the future. I also bequeath to him In witness wherefore I have hereunto set my
hand and seal the the Third day of October in the year of our Lord 1887

At a County Court held for Buckingham County November 14th 1892. The foregoing
writing purporting to be the last will and Testament of Sallie H. Coleman deceased was
then read pronounced in Court, and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto, Martha J.
Shepard and Willly Coleman were sworn, who testified that they are well acquainted
with the handwriting of the testatrix, and readily believe the said writing and the
name thereto subscribed to be wholly written by the own hand of the testatrix.
Whereupon the said writing is ordered to be recorded as the true last will and
Testament of the said Sallie H. Coleman deceased.
