green counterpane, Red and Blue

2. I give and bequeath to Joseph Dunkum, son of John Dunkum, one feather
bed and one bed quilt

3. The residue of my estate, both real and personal, including my interest
in the estate of my brother Stephen Ayres dec^d. I give to Ann Maria Bagby in
consideration of her faithful attendance on me in my old age

I appoint James C. Haines Executor of this my last Will

At a County Court held for Buckingham County, May 12th 1879. This paper
writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Martha Lesueur dec^d was this
day produced in Court and proved by the oaths of W^m M. Hall and S. H. Brown, the
subscribing witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of
James C. Haines, the Executor named in said Will, who made oath thereto, and with
S. H. Brown his security entered into and acknowledges a bond in the penalty of
fifty dollars, conditioned according to law, security sworn to justify, certificate is
granted the said Executor for obtaining a probat of the said Will in due form
