In the Name of God Amen. I Matthew A. Cox of Buckingham Co. State of Va. do make, publish and declare this my last Will and Testament.

I give and devise to my son Matt. I Cox, my wife, and my daughter Ann E. Cox my tract of land in said County known as my residence. My wife to have only her life interest therein and should my daughter Ann E. marry, her interest in same will be forfeited to said son Matthew I. Therein except about two hundred acres lying south and east of my residence known as the Old Place which said 200 acres I give to my daughter Ann E. Cox and Lucy I. Hooper, my sons Henry C. Cox and John B. Cox, to be divided equally among them.

I give and devise to my daughter Ann E. a house and lot at or near Courdsville. I give and bequeath to my son Matt. I my daughter Ann E. and my wife all my horses, cattle, hogs and sheep which I may own at my death. I give to my son Matthew I. all my farming tools and utensils. I give and bequeath what money I may possess equally to my son Matt. I and daughter Ann E. I will that all bonds and debts due me be collected and divided equally among my children John B. Henry C. Ann E. Matt. I. and Lucy I.

I give and bequeath all my household and kitchen furniture to my wife, my son Matt. I. my daughters Ann E. and Lucy I.

I appoint my son Matt. I. my sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament to qualify and act as such without giving bond and security. In testimony
